5. Monthly Report of Enforcement Cases Settled:

Eight enforcement cases were resolved by settlement agreements executed in May 2013 as follows:

SETTLEMENTS OF SUBDIVISION VIOLATIONS (5)

These settlements authorize the illegal lots involved in each case, allocate principal building rights, require a permit for future land use or development as appropriate, and require the filing of the settlement in the county clerk's office.

- Number of Lots Subdivision (2) E2013-0040, Valente, (Putnam, Washington County) E2013-0047, LaPorte (Saranac, Clinton County)
- Wetland Subdivision (1) E2005-0023C, Tillema, (Franklin, Franklin County)
- Substandard Lot Subdivision (2)
 E2013-0022, Jankowski, (Providence, Saratoga County)
 E2005-0095A, Black, (Long Lake, Hamilton County)

OTHER VIOLATIONS (3)

E2013-0021, Towns of Black Brook and Jay, (Jay, Essex Counties)

• Construction of a Quonset hut structure within the shoreline setback of the Ausable River without the necessary Agency approval in 1991. Settlement requires implementation of Agency approved plan for resolution.

E2012-0165, DeMarco (Putnam, Washington)

• Construction of a single family dwelling in excess of 40 feet in height in 2000 by a prior owner, and construction of a deck and stairway between 2000 and 2004 within the shoreline setback of Lake George by a prior owner without the necessary Agency approvals. Settlement recognizes single family dwelling as lawful, requires implementation of a planting and shoreline structure remediation plan, and requires implementation of a plan for upgrading the on-site wastewater treatment system on the property. Settlement also places restrictions on the single family dwelling color, lighting, and removal of vegetation from the property.

E2011-0020, Stumpf, (Fine, St. Lawrence County)

• Amended Settlement Agreement to address single family dwelling constructed in Resource Management and establishment of an absorption field of an on-site wastewater treatment system within 100 feet of a wetland in 2006 without the necessary Agency approvals. Settlement recognizes single family dwelling as lawful, requires addition of an aerobic treatment unit to the onsite wastewater treatment system prior to conveyance of the property or any increased occupancy of the single family dwelling, and places restrictions on the property regarding lighting and vegetation removal.
