5. Monthly Report of Enforcement Cases Settled:

Nine enforcement cases were resolved by settlement agreements executed in **June and July, 2014** as follows:

SETTLEMENTS OF SUBDIVISION VIOLATIONS (3)

These settlements authorize the illegal lots involved in each case, allocate principal building rights, require a permit for future land use or development as appropriate, and require the filing of the settlement in the county clerk's office.

• Wetland subdivision (3)

E2014-0046, Poirer (Ellenburg, Clinton County) E2014-0046A, Poirer (Ellenburg, Clinton County) E2013-0156A, Sylvester (Ellenburg, Clinton County)

Other Violations (6)

E2011-0078, Casale (Lake George, Warren County)

• Construction of a single family dwelling in excess of 40 feet in height in 2009. Settlement Agreement recognizes the single family dwelling as lawful, requires implementation of Agency-approved wastewater treatment and stormwater management plans, places restrictions on expansion of the dwelling, restricts vegetative cutting on the property, and requires payment of a \$500 civil penalty.

E2013-0009, Isabella (Harrietstown, Franklin County)

• Installation of on-site wastewater treatment system in noncompliance with Agency Permit P2003-0123 in 2004. Settlement Agreement requires landowner to relocate the absorption field component of the wastewater treatment system so that it meets the requirements of the Adirondack Park Agency Act and the New York State Department of Health

E2014-0023, Gardner (Hopkinton, St.Lawrence County)

• Construction of a garage within a designated recreational river area without the necessary Agency permit, also resulting in the deposit of fill in a wetland. Settlement recognizes garage as lawful, requires stabilization of disturbed soils, and payment of a \$250 civil penalty.

E2014-0074, Bombard (Black Brook, Clinton County)

• Construction of a deck attached to the shoreline side of a single family dwelling and partially within 50 feet of the mean high water mark of Fern Lake. Settlement requires implementation of Agency-approved remediation plan and payment of a \$250 civil penalty.

E2014-0043, McLean, (Broadalbin, Fulton County)

• Deposit of fill in a wetland. Settlement requires removal of fill from the wetland, stabilization of all disturbed areas, and payment of a \$500 civil penalty.

E2014-0029, Stevenson (Fort Ann, Washington County)

• Deposit of fill in a wetland. Measures completed to address impacts to wetlands. Settlement requires payment of a \$500 civil penalty.
