5. Monthly Report of Enforcement Cases Settled:

Three enforcement cases were resolved by settlement agreements executed in **August 2014** as follows:

SETTLEMENTS OF SUBDIVISION VIOLATIONS (1)

These settlements authorize the illegal lots involved in each case, allocate principal building rights, require a permit for future land use or development as appropriate, and require the filing of the settlement in the county clerk's office.

• Lot Counting Subdivision (1)

E2014-0031A Eklund, (Ohio, Herkimer County)

Other Violations (2)

E2014-0027 Sears, (North Elba, Essex County)

• Vegetation removal and construction of a structure in noncompliance with Agency Permit 2008-272. Settlement requires planting vegetation, places requirements on the future removal of vegetation, restricts the existing structure, and requires payment of a \$500 civil penalty.

E2014-0070 Trudeau/Dufour, (Moriah, Essex County)

• Height expansion of two pre-existing single family dwellings located partially within the shoreline setback of Lake Champlain without the necessary variance. Settlement requires implementation of an Agency-approved remediation plan, payment of a \$1500 civil penalty, and filing in the county clerk's office.
