SETTLEMENTS OF SUBDIVISION VIOLATIONS (4)

These settlements authorize the illegal lots involved in each case, allocate principal building rights, require a permit for future land use or development as appropriate, and require the filing of the settlement in the county clerk's office.

• Amendment of a Settlement Agreement executed in 2004 to address a subdivision involving wetlands and the construction of a single family dwelling and associated wastewater treatment system by a prior landowner in 1992 without the necessary Agency approvals. Settlement Agreement Amendment allocates principal building rights, recognizes property as lawful, establishes requirements for replacement of the on-site wastewater treatment system, and requires filing in the County Clerk's Office.
