5. Monthly Report of Enforcement Cases Settled:

Three enforcement cases were resolved by settlement agreements executed in **May 2015** as follows:

SETTLEMENTS OF SUBDIVISION VIOLATIONS (1)

These settlements authorize the illegal lots involved in each case, allocate principal building rights, require a permit for future land use or development as appropriate, and require the filing of the settlement in the county clerk's office.

Wetland Subdivision (1)

E2015-0028, Lepska (Stratford, Fulton County)

SETTLEMENTS OF OTHER VIOLATIONS (2)

- E2015-0039, Shue (Webb, Herkimer County)
 Construction of a series of connected patios, stairways, decks and
 retaining walls, undertaken in 1981, within 50 feet of the mean high
 water mark of the Middle Branch Moose River. Settlement restricts
 vegetation removal within 50 feet of the river and requires filing in the
 County Clerk's Office.
- E2012-0021D, Silver Lake Timber (Saranac, Clinton County)
 Further subdivision in 2004, through county tax foreclosure sale, of property authorized by Agency Permit P82-127AT. Settlement recognizes resulting lot as lawful, restricts lot to one principal building, and requires filing in the County Clerk's Office.
