5. Monthly Report of Enforcement Cases Settled:

Six enforcement cases were resolved by settlement agreements executed in **October 2015** as follows:

SETTLEMENTS OF SUBDIVISION VIOLATIONS (4)

These settlements authorize the illegal lots involved in each case, allocate principal building rights, require a permit for future land use or development as appropriate, and require the filing of the settlement in the county clerk's office.

E2015-0074, Vann (Saranac, Clinton County)

 Wetland fill. Settlement Agreement requires removal of the fill and payment of a \$200 civil penalty.

E2015-0068, Messmer (Chester, Warren County)

 Expansion of a pre-existing accessory structure in 1979, resulting in a single family dwelling closer to the mean high water mark of the designated Hudson River Recreational River and located within 150 feet of the mean high water mark. Settlement requires replacement of the on-site wastewater treatment system associated with the single family dwelling within three years and places restrictions on lighting, color, and removal of vegetation on the property. Settlement requires filing in the County Clerk's Office.
