5. <u>Monthly Report of Enforcement Cases Settled</u>:

Nine enforcement cases were resolved by settlement agreements executed in **September 2016** as follows:

• E2016-0091A, Marsha, (Chesterfield, Essex County)

Subdivision involving wetlands in 2007. Settlement recognizes lot as lawful and allocates principal buildings, requires a permit for any on-site wastewater treatment system within 100 feet of wetlands, and requires Agency review of further subdivisions, roads, driveways, or structures within 100 feet of wetlands. Settlement must be filed in the County Clerk's Office.

• E2016-0111, Kircher, (Hague, Warren County)

Subdivision of property in 1989 that was designated as "open space" as part of authorizations under Agency Interim Project #36. Settlement recognizes property as merged with adjoining lot, allows for construction of one principal building on the adjoining lot only, and requires filing in the County Clerk's Office.

• E2016-0100, Tripp, (Saranac, Clinton County)

Clearcutting more than three acres within a wetland since 2015. Settlement requires landowner to cease tree cutting within the wetland and allow to revegetate, obtain written authorization from the Agency prior to further timber harvesting on the property, and payment of a \$500 civil penalty.

• E2016-0072, Shaw, (North Hudson, Essex County)

Construction of a single family dwelling in Resource Management and pond in noncompliance with Permit 2008-66, and installation of an onsite wastewater treatment system in noncompliance with Permit 2008-66 and within 100 feet of a stream. Settlement recognizes dwelling as lawful, restricts color of the dwelling, requires wastewater treatment system to be disconnected and installation of a new system that meets standards, submission of an updated Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan, and payment of a \$750 civil penalty.

• E2015-0026, Irish, (Wells, Hamilton County)

Subdivision involving wetlands in 2001. Amended Settlement Agreement recognizes property as lawful, requires Agency review of future land use or development or subdivision, and allows for a proposed two-lot subdivision of the property.

• E2015-0170B, Sinuc, (Chester, Warren County)

Construction of a driveway, single family dwelling, onsite wastewater treatment system, and well in 2006 in locations other than what was approved by Permit 85-45. Settlement recognizes development as lawful, limits vegetation removal on the property, requires upgrading of the wastewater treatment system upon replacement or failure, and filing in the County Clerk's Office.

• E2014-0114, Buckley, (Russia, Herkimer County)

Construction of a retaining wall with attached deck in 2012, within 75 feet of the mean high water mark of Hinckley Reservoir. Settlement requires implementation of Agency-approved plans to remove portions of the wall and deck.

• E2016-0092, Kleinhammer, (Chesterfield, Essex County)

Installation of culvert and access in 2016, in a location other than what was approved by Agency Permit 96-294R. Settlement recognizes location as lawful and requires filing in the County Clerk's Office.

• E2016-0018, Moose House Management, LLC, (North Hudson, Essex County)

Resource Management subdivision in 2002. Settlement recognizes property as lawful, requires installation of an alarm on existing holding tank upgrading of onsite wastewater treatment system prior to conveyance or upon replacement or failure of the existing system, and filing in the County Clerk's Office.
