Guidelines for Management and Use – Basic Guidelines (SLMP pg. 41)

Primary management guideline will be to provide public opportunities for recreation in a setting and scale in harmony with the relatively wild and undeveloped character of the Adirondack Park

Guidelines for Management and Use – Basic Guidelines (SLMP pg. 41)

All intensive use facilities should be located, designed and managed to blend with the Adirondack environment and have minimum adverse impact on surrounding state and private lands

Guidelines for Management and Use – Basic Guidelines (SLMP pg. 41 & 42)

Construction and development activities will:

- avoid material alteration of wetlands;
- minimize extensive topographic alterations;
- limit vegetative clearing;
- preserve the scenic, natural and open space resources of the intensive use area.
