


TAKEAWAYS

Collaborative, science-based approaches are critical to addressing environmental challenges.

MAPPING FOREST CARBON

- Aid staff in identifying areas where solar energy development may be suitable by highlighting land cover that has high carbon sequestration or storage value.



MAPPING DEEPWATER MARSHES



- Monitor ecological changes, assist with managing aquatic invasive species, and protect habitat from degradation, ensuring sustainable natural resource management in the Park.

PUBLIC LANDS FOR ALL

- Started year with Classification Package, led into SLMP amendments.
- Robust public engagement with hearings.
- Received over **1,200** public comments
- Underscores value of the process to the Agency.



ADIRONDACK PLANNING FORUM

- Over 250 attendees at the 2024 Adirondack Planning Forum
- Brought together stakeholders to learn about and find solutions to the Park's biggest issues



IMPROVING DIGITAL OUTREACH



- Addressed core goals of 2021 Transparency Initiative
- Established consistent social media outreach – Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn
- Gained 1,500 followers in 2024; 6,500 total
- Internal working group redesigning website to better support the public


Park communities are facing major challenges—and key state programs can help.

- Agency helped promote NY Forward, DRI, and Pro-Housing Community Program.




COMMUNITY HOUSING MAP



STAFFING


- **30% staffing increase in two years.**
- Reversing a nearly two-decade decline.
- Additions and promotions in all divisions.
- Aiming for 59 FTEs in 2025.




TELECOMMUNICATIONS

- Increased telecommunication coverage in 2024 with continued uptick in Small Cell Technology.
- General Permit 2023G-1 streamlines collocation.
- To date, the Agency has successfully approved 590 permits for telecommunication projects.





Telecom Permits Issued (2015-2024)



Telecommunication Permitting


- Permit Locations - 2024 only
- * Permit Locations - all years






WETLANDS

- This was in addition to desktop reviews and other forms of support.




2024 Adirondack Park Agency Wetland Site Visits

PERMITTING

- Over 3x increase in Emergency Authorizations— from 9 to 30.
- Climate change drive-storms increasing in frequency and severity.
- Allows communities to immediately address storm impacts

ENFORCEMENT

- Nearly doubled settlement agreements signed.
- Increased voluntary compliance by 30%
- The majority of enforcement cases involved wetlands and shorelines.
- A new process for permit compliance has supported these outcomes.

- Increase in JIF inquiries from 1,158 to 1,239
- Staff reduced average response time by 2 days (7 to 5).
